



















HARMONIZING SUCCESS

Fourteen-year-old Little Brother Antoine "AJ" has an incredible bond with his Big Brother Siddhesh "Sidd."

"We've been matched for 2 years now and just had a whale of a time together," says Sidd.

Both enjoy being outdoors and often go hiking together. Sidd regularly attends AJ's sports games, to cheer and encourage his Little. They've visited Timeline Arcade, created bird boxes at Nixon Park, gone bowling and explored York County hiking trails.

Sidd is always there for AJ, sharing new experiences and providing his Little with thoughtful advice. Sidd leads by example as he encourages AJ to stay focused even in the face of difficult experiences.

When asked what he's learned from his Big, AJ says, "If someone is knocking you down in life you just have to keep on going."

Sidd and AJ were chosen to perform in the 98th Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade® on November 28, 2024. They were among 20 Bigs and Littles – selected from an extensive talent search – invited to join Macy's colleagues and Sebastián Yatra as they took center stage and traveled through New York City on Thanksgiving morning to spread joy and cheer to millions of live spectators and viewers nationwide.



THE CIRCLE OF MENTORSHIP

Paul, a young boy grappling with the absence of a father figure, first encountered Adrian at the karate gym. Adrian was a man who radiated strength and compassion and in him Paul found a mentor and a friend.

In 2015 Paul chose to volunteer as a Big Brother saying, "BBBS is offering kids something I feel they are missing, something I missed growing up as well, and that's someone to listen to them and support them."

Paul, drawing from the well of wisdom passed down by Adrian, became a mentor in his own right, guiding Ethan's future with the same care and dedication he had once received. And, in 2023 Paul proudly watched Ethan receive a leadership award from his high school JROTC, inspired to pursue a military career, following in his mentor's footsteps.

"[It was] such a cool night for him and I was so happy to be able to attend," shared Paul. "Ethan is so deserving of love and support, and I am truly grateful and honored that I get to be a part of his life and to watch him grow into the strong leader our community needs."

Together, Adrian and Paul exemplified the essence of generosity and selflessness, their actions speaking volumes that are echoing across generations.

1:1 MENTORING PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY-BASED



Our best-known and most flexible program. Bigs and Littles meet 2 to 4 times a month and decide on what they'll do. Bigs expand their Littles' worldview and introduce them to new experiences through community activities and everyday conversation.

SITE-BASED

For children, teens and adults who prefer more structure. Bigs and Littles meet at a designated location. Our school-based programs (Bigs in Schools, Bigs in Blue, HS Bigs & College Bigs) made up 80% of our total matches in 2024. The match meets at the Little's school before, during or after school.



BIGS IN SCHOOLS

Mentors and youth meet several times per month at the child's school or youth center.

HS BIGS & COLLEGE BIGS

High school & college students learn leadership skills while volunteering as mentors at elementary & middle schools.



SPORTS BUDDIES

Bigs and Littles meet at their local YMCA to swim, play basketball, workout and participate in YMCA-hosted programs.



BEYOND SCHOOL WALLS

This customized workforce development mentoring program introduces high school students to regional professionals. Students and adult mentors meet bi-monthly at a corporate, educational or community location, to inspire and prepare students for their future.

BIGS IN BLUE

A national initiative designed to introduce youth to active-duty law enforcement officers who serve as mentors. Each officer meets with their Little a few times each month on-site at the child's school.

YOUTH RIS

This program empowers youth to lead, influence, and inspire through student-led conversations focused on amplifying youth voice and empowerment. HS students are paired with middle school mentees to build meaningful connections and foster positive dialogue.



WORKFORGE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Big Brothers Big Sisters of America established Beyond School Walls (BSW) in 2008 to address workforce development needs and job readiness skills. Launched locally in 2016 with Capital Blue Cross as our pilot program, our multi-year program connects students with mentors at area businesses.






Mentees, with the support of their mentors, developed business pitches for a product that would help their communities.

The inspiration came from a similar device that Shawnae says a family member has, but it does not work. She hopes a device like this can be created in the future to help those who suffer from seizures and other medical conditions.

What makes it even better is that I'm pretty sure he had no idea that I was coming in for a visit on that day.




